Division meetings move to Maplewood this Fall

By a vote of 31 to 9, the Twin Cities Division membership present at the May 2003 Business Meeting agreed to move the regular monthly meeting location from the Osseo United Methodist Church to the Maplewood Moose Lodge. This decision was the result of intense discussion at the meeting and a year of investigation by members of the TCD Board.

The new meeting location is in the basement below the lower level of the Lodge. See the map below.

The subject of a venue change had been brought up at the May 2002 Business Meeting, where it was decided that the TCD Board of Directors would act as an exploratory committee to locate possible alternate locations. While all agreed that the Midway area of St. Paul would be ideal because of its central Metro location, no suitable meeting sites were found there.


A spirited, hour-long discussion followed the motion to move the meeting locale. Relative merits of both the Osseo and Maplewood locations were compared, including location, access, parking, multimedia resources, and smoking/non-smoking issues.

The motion was carried by hand vote of the 40 members present -- a number determined to be a quorum based on Robert's Rules Online.

OTHER MEETING NEWS

New officers were nominated and elected at the meeting. Lynn McCall became Superintendent and Bill Dredge, Al Dowd, and Neil Maldeis were voted in as Assistant Superintendent, Chief Clerk, and Layout Coordinator, respectively.

A motion was also made to change the meeting time from 7:30pm to 7:00pm, but after brief discussion the membership agreed to take this subject up at the May 2004 meeting.

Division members go one-on-one with the 261

utgoing Director-at-Large for Layout Tours Steve Nitti called it "the ultimate layout tour...my crowning achievement" as Division members got a close encounter behind closed doors with one of the most famous steamers still running in the Midwest, the Milwaukee Road 261. The event took place on Saturday, May 10, 2003, from noon to 4 p.m.

Because the engine was in for routine servicing, members were able to get a first-hand look at details of the fire-box, smokebox, valve gear, and other parts of the engine that would have been totally inaccessible if it had been fired up.

Friends of the 261 were on-hand to explain some of the nuances of this hulking 4-8-4: its massive firebox, with a floor area of 100 square feet,

takes 20 hours to fire up and then eats a ton of coal every 12 to 15 miles. The tender carries 35 tons of the stuff.

The 261 was one of 10 engines in this series, and was the last steam delivered to the Milwaukee Road shops. Its enclosed cab made it pleasant to operate, and its steel cast pilot made it distinctive in appearance.

The 261 was retired in 1956 and sent to the Green Bay Railroad Museum. In 1989/1990 it was completely disassembled, restored, and brought up to current railroad standards.

A big thanks to Steve Nitti and the Friends of the 261 for organizing this rare opportunity!

NMRA model contest to be held at GATS

Get your models ready, because this year's Twin Cities Great American Train Show will feature an NMRA-sanctioned model contest sponsored by the Division. The contest is open to all NMRA members in good standing, and will be held on Saturday, October 25. Entries will be accepted and registered between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m., with judging taking place from 12:30 to 4:30 p.m.

If you're planning to enter, complete the contest paperwork for each entry in advance, since it's time consuming. This will not only save you time at the show, it'll result in a more thorough description of your modeling efforts -- something beneficial to the judging process. Advance copies of the forms, plus other contest information, are available on the NMRA's web page (www.nmra.org). Completed copies of the contest entry form (#901) and the model contest judge's score sheet (#902) are required for each model entry. Only the contest entry form is required for each photo entry.

All models entered will be judged for merit points. First, Second, and Third Places will be determined by total points earned. In order for an entry to place, it must earn a minimum of 62.5 points (50% of the total possible points). A model does not have to earn a merit award to qualify for a contest award.

All model and photo entries must be original work done by the contestant. A model or photo which has previously earned First Place in a Regional or National Contest is ineligible.

On May 10, 2003 Twin Cities Division members got a chance to take the ultimate "layout tour"



The contest categories are: Steam Locos, Diesel Locos and Other Motive Power, Passenger Cars, Freight Cars, Cabooses, Non-revenue Cars, Traction, On-line Structures, Off-line Structures, On-line Displays, Off-line Displays, Prototype Color Prints, Prototype Black & White Prints, Prototype Slides, Model Color Prints, Model Black & White Prints, Model Slides.

Photo entries must be mounted on rigid board or matted with a similar material. No glass frames are allowed. Photo and mount can not exceed 12" x 16". Minimum mount size is 8" x 10" and minimum print size is 5" x 7". A maximum of ten photo entries, with no more than five in any one category, will be allowed

by any one entrant.

There will be awards for First, Second, and Third Place winners in all categories. In addition, a Youth Award will be presented to the highest point total model submitted by a contestant 18 years old or younger and a Best of Show award will be presented to the model entry with the highest judged point total.

McCall takes top honors in KC photo contest

Our own Superintendent, Lynn McCall, took top honors in two categories of the photo contest held at the Mid-Continent Regional in Kansas City last May.

In all, he received two First Place awards: one for a slide submitted in the "Modeling" category and the other for a slide submitted in the "Prototype" category. Lynn also received Second and Third Place awards for entries in the "Prototype" category.

Modeling Tips & Tricks

CA Gap Filler – Thick formulas of CA are good for filling small gaps, but to fill larger gaps, sprinkle some baking soda into the crack or hole, pat it down and shape it, then put a drop or two of CA into the baking soda. It'll turn hard as a rock. It's sandable, too!

CA Applicator – Find a sewing needle with a larger eye and use a cut-off disk in a Dremel to lop the top of the eye off, leaving a "Y" shape. Use that to apply a very small drop of CA to a model in exactly the place you want it.



To make it even easier to use, make a handle by mounting the needle in a piece of dowel.

Cleaning the Applicator – The CA applicator will get gunked up eventually. To clean it, soak the tip in a little Acetone. Cut a disc of foam slightly larger than the neck of an empty glass paint jar (a 1/2 ounce Polly Scale jar is great), drill a small hole in the center of the foam, and put the disc in the bottle neck. To clean the needle push it through the hole to let it soak in the Acetone. The foam keeps the Acetone from evaporating too quickly.
